This year, Holiday 2020 retailers are posting record sales online and in stores combined, which means...we will have record numbers of boxes, gift wrap, and packing pieces including Styrofoam™ and bubble wrap.

Waste Management, which collects all the garbage, compost, and recycling pickup in the Seattle metro area, wants you to know how NOT to contaminate your recycling bin this year! Styrofoam is NOT recyclable in the usual recycling bin.

Easy rules of thumb: NO Plastic BAGS, CLEAN and DRY plastic 1 & 2, all glass, paper, and CLEAN cardboard (pizza boxes go in the compost!). Here's the link for further information:

*"Polystyrene foam plastic (like foam packing peanuts) is not recyclable, so we are not able to accept it for recycling at this time. Before discarding items like foam packing peanuts in the trash, consider taking them to your local mail and packaging store for reuse, typically without charge."*

Styrorecycle.com accepts drop-offs of clean, dry Polystyrene #6 AND packing peanuts, but you must drive to Kent to their drop off location. Other options include:

All material must be clean, dry, and free of tape and labels.

- Shoreline (Free) Shoreline Transfer Station.
- Kent (Free) StyroRecycle.
- **Seattle** - SODO (Free)
