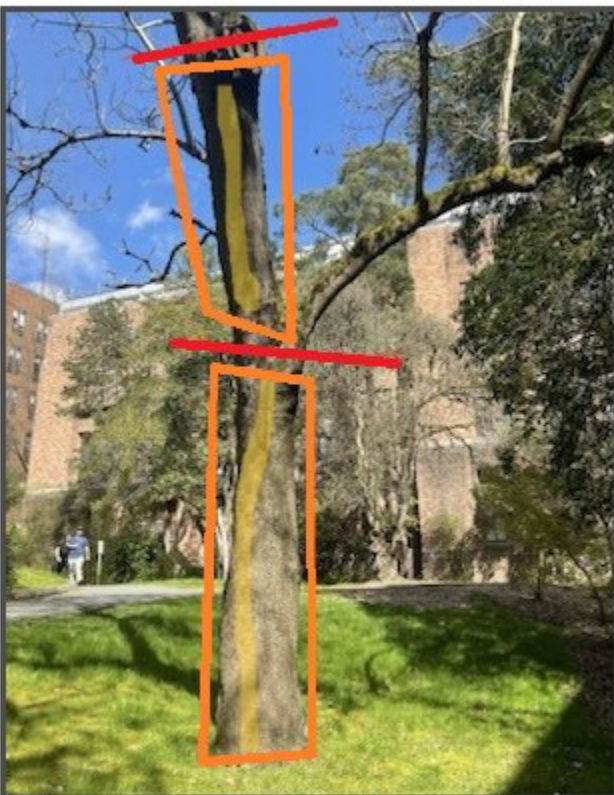


UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON SALVAGE WOOD CONSIDERATIONS - BROWN SHEET

University of Washington's Salvage Wood Program provides a 2nd life to campus trees. UW carpenters mill and kiln dry the wood for use in furniture, plaques, cutting boards and custom pieces. Students utilized campus wood in furniture design classes.

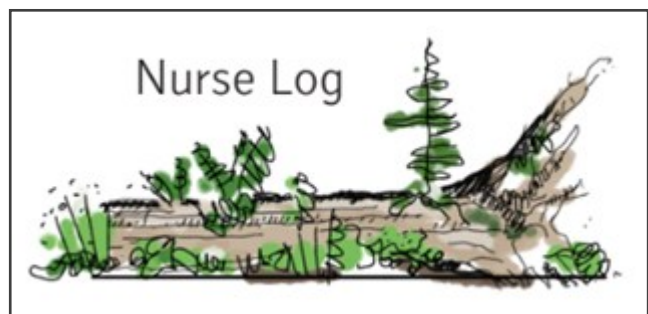


4725: Two sections of trunk

Which Trees are Salvaged?

The carpenters will choose salvage (Lumber Salvage) trees based on species, size, and shape. Not every tree will be salvaged. The project landscape architect may also salvage trees (Landscape Salvage) to use in the landscape as a nurse log or other feature. Landscape Salvage trees are coordinated by the landscape architect. Lumber Salvage trees are coordinated by UW Arborist.

Logistics

- Send tree removal list to the Campus Arborist as soon as possible
- The arborist will provide a "cut list" and "tree tags".
- Site Walk to review cut list and hand off tree tags before tree removal
- Logs are dropped in a designated area on the east side of campus. Drop off coordination is required and all trees must be tagged with the appropriate number at the end of each log.
